- 2. Why do you think this displeases Samuel, in verse 6?
- 3. According to verses 7 to 9, who are they really rejecting and what does their request for a king equate to?
- 4. Look at verses 10 to 18. How would you describe the behaviour of human kings? What word is used repeatedly to describe their behaviour?
- 5. According to verse 17, what would be the result of human kingship?
- 6. Can you think of times when the Israelites cried out to God for relief in the past? When were they? What did God do?



- 7. According to verse 18, what will God do when the Israelites cry out for relief this time?
- 8. What would the Israelites gain by choosing human kingship and what would they lose?
- 9. Why do you think they go ahead with it anyway, in verse 19?
- 10. What is significant about their desire to be 'like all the other nations' in verse 20?
- 11. In what ways is the kingship of Jesus different to the kingship described in these verses?
 - What do we gain and lose by following him?
 - Why is his kingship easy to embrace?
- 12. In what ways are you tempted to be like the other people around you?
 - What will help you to keep living distinctively?
